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Wildlife Window: The Great Horned Owl Distinctive Late-Night Call. Effective Predators.

Often heard at night in Rivendell, but difficult to see, is the Great Horned Owl. Great horned owls make a variety of noises, but their most common call is a 4-5 note "whoo, whoo, whoo, whoo." Often heard calling back and forth to their mate, a male owl's call is deeper, while a female owl's call will have a higher pitch.

The owl was the constant companion of Athena, the Greek goddess of wisdom; so by association, the owl has come to be identified as wise. Florida is fortunate to be the home to five species of owls. Our owls are most helpful in keeping pesky rodent populations to a manageable level. Smaller owls contribute by eating cockroaches.

The Great Horned Owl (Bubo virginianus) is the largest of Florida's owls. If you see one often high up in a tree, it is a magical sight. Let's learn more about these magnificent predators.



Appearance, Diet & Behavior

The Great Horned Owl's head tufts resemble ears. It can stand a bit taller than the barred owl at 18 to 25 inches with a wingspan of 36 to 60 inches. Unlike the brown eyes of the barred owl, the great horned owl has glowing yellow eyes. Hard to spot, with their patchy grey, brown, and tan body, large yellow eyes, reddish-brown feathers around their face ringed with black, and white chin feathers. Like most raptors (birds of prey), female great horned owls are larger than the males.

A formidable predator, this bird's diet includes rodents, rabbits, skunks, opossums, ducks, domestic cats, snakes (including copperheads & rattle-snakes) and other owls.

Living in forests, prairies, swamps, and marshes, it will raise one to four owlets a year in nests located in broad forks of trees or vacant nests of other raptors.

Fascinating Facts

Some extraordinary features of owls include their ability to swivel their heads 270 degrees so they can take a backward look. This is because their eyes are so large, their eyeballs cannot move either side to side, or up and down.

Another highly defined owl sense is their hearing. Their ears are placed just behind their eyes and are well hidden by flaps of skin and feathers. (Those tufts of feathers some owls have look like ears but are not!)

Owls swallow their food whole, but if their prey is too large, they vomit up the indigestible remains. (These are identified as "owl pellets" and are quite intriguing - you will find bones, fur, and teeth.)

PRESERVES MANAGEMENT PLAN Rivendell has 115 acres: 14 Wetlands & Upland Preserves.

- As a key part of our stormwater system, preserves and buffer areas must be left alone. Any activity beyond a homeowners' property line is considered an incursion. Do not plant, build, cut or remove any vegetation, or deposit yard waste in protected areas. Incursions are monitored regularly and violations enforced. Incursion remediation costs everyone.
- Vital maintenance also involves wildfire mitigation & ecological mowing to clear perimeter paths, grates, weirs, and bubblers, as well as treatment and removal of invasives, such as cattails, that block outflow structures, causing flooding.
- Ongoing preserve management actions include: removing invasive plants, and inspection & correction of incursions in preserve & buffer areas.

PONDS MANAGEMENT PLAN

Rivendell has 23 Named Ponds with 65 acres of Open Water.

- Our HOA is responsible for the maintenance of the Stormwater Detention System that controls flooding, including all ponds, preserves, wetlands, shorelines, and community common ground.
- Erosion is visible on most pond shorelines. It is being managed by installing "Rivendell Natural Shorelines." Now codified in our Covenants, 3-foot LMZs (Low-Maintenance Zones) are installed, while aquatic plants are being planted in phases with a goal to surround each pond with beneficial native vegetation.



- Our HOA landscape contractor keeps LMZs trimmed to a rounded height of 8-12 inches for a neat & uniform look.
 Plants are emergent, shoreline FL native species that help absorb nutrients, reduce runoff and control erosion.
- Transition from toxic herbicides to healthier options in the management plan for algae control and invasive plant growth.
- Benefits: Stabilize shoreline banks. Filter excess nutrient runoff. Improve water quality. Avoid costly remediation. Enhance wildlife habitats. Keep property values strong.

Homeowners' & Residents' Important Role

- Reduce water usage where possible. Only if needed, irrigate
 on your assigned day and not between 10am 4pm. Sarasota
 County issued a new watering schedule as of January 2023 (see
 chart for your Watering Day.) Inspect & maintain good working
 sprinklers, heads, and rain sensors.
- Follow Sarasota County guidelines for responsible fertilizing and irrigation. Respect the nitrogen-phosphorous fertilizer ban between June 1 – Sept. 30. Do not fertilize within 10 feet of any preserve, pond or any hardscape surfaces. Iron-based fertilizers are an effective alternative.



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Will They or Won't They?

While the spotting of Sand Hill Cranes in our neighborhood is fairly common, watching them build a nest is a special sight. The last weeks in November, a pair – Sandhills mate for life – has been seen working diligently in the littoral zone in Rivendell Lake. According to The Cornell Lab:

Sandhill Cranes usually nest in small, isolated wetlands—such as marshes, bogs, and swales—or within about 300 yards of the edges of larger ones. They prefer areas with vegetation growing in standing water, but some nest on

dry ground. It's not known whether males or females choose the nest site. If one member of a pair dies, the surviving member may reuse its previous nesting area with a new mate. Both mates may gather material, tossing it over their shoulders to form a mound. The female is usually the one to stand on the mound and arrange the material. Nests may be 30-40 inches across and 4-6 inches high; those built over water are larger than those built on dry land.

In previous years, this area has been used for nesting and the baby Sand Hills, called Colts, were very special new neighbors in Rivendell. Fingers crossed for new arrivals this spring.
