are some minor increases in the proposed plan and the possibility there may be rollover funds to offset the increases.

Another issue is the election of new Board members for 2026. At this point in time, some of the experienced Board will be leaving management and there will be as many as three seats available. There are many folks in Rivendell who have the experience and expertise to manage the community in an ethical and fiscally responsible manner. 

A Cry for Help! - Would You Recognize It?


(The following is a fictional scenario – but is very real across our world!)

Imagine you are in a store, busily shopping with a companion. A young person near you, one that's with an older adult, makes eye contact with you and seems to have eyes pleading to be noticed. You see this, you poke your companion, and they too take notice. The young person looks away, looks down at their feet and their hand is behind their back. Slowly, their hand makes an open palm with their thumb across the middle of their hand. Then this person closes their hand, making essentially a fist with their thumb enclosed. You look at your companion who whispers, "I think that's a cry for help – first the open hand and then the closed hand." We make eye contact once more as the young person looks back at us and I nod my head. We walk quickly to the store cashier, describe what we had just seen and ask the cashier to call 9-1-1!

This type of "cry for help" is getting all too common in our society. Amber alerts, human trafficking, the most vulnerable being abused and taken advantage of. Would you recognize the signs? If you saw the sign and understood, would you take the next step and assist in getting help?

The graphic of the "cry of help" added to this story is a simple hand gesture to memorize – and one to teach our children and grand-children. It may one day save their lives!

Then too – we don't often hear of "elder abuse" but it too is all too real. Memorize these two hand signals and it may one day save your life!

Memories Of A Teacher....

Being a high school teacher, you meet all kinds of kids and one young man I'll always remember is one who skipped my class and took a zero on the assignment for the day.

Generally, kids who skip school or class will get their parents to cover for them by writing an excuse saying the child was sick so the student can make up any work missed.

Well, this particular student stood in front of me and told me he was sorry but he didn't have an excuse. I reminded him that he still had a day to bring in the excuse and I could still accept his work. He said that wouldn't happen because he had cut my class. He then apologized for cutting my class and said he knew I wouldn't be able to accept his work.

So why was this particular student memorable? He lost an easy 10 points by my not being able to accept his homework that day, so that couldn't have made him memorable.


What then could have made this student so memorable?

Well, from my point of view, it wasn't what he lost, but what he GAINED.

Yes, on that particular day, this young man gained a world of respect in my eyes when he stood before me and presented no parental excuse for his behavior but instead accepted the consequences for his behavior.

Fortunately for him, we did not have a test or quiz that day. As it was, his grades were high enough that a loss of 10 points was not going to be significant, but what was significant was how much that student jumped in my respect for him that day. If he ever needed a recommendation, I knew I could write a glowing one for a student who was so truthful, who valued his personal honor and integrity so highly.

He may not have been an A+ student, but he certainly was a good one. He was a likeable student who loved to learn and who was intrigued by challenging assignments. I remember him as a shy student who tended to pick a desk near the back of the room but that never meant he wasn't attentive. I figured he just didn't think he had the material things needed to fit in with the "in crowd" of our school and maybe he thought sitting in the back might help him better fade into the background. Whatever the case, he had one of those "light bulb" kind of smiles, a voice that may not have been as loud as others, but he was engaged and participating to the nth degree and he was a joy to have had in class.



I don't remember why he skipped school that day and ended up cutting my class. I guess he just needed a break. It was spring time, the school year was closing down, and he either went fishing or just went downtown to hang out, but why he skipped was not important.

What was important was how this young man handled the aftermath. When he stood before me telling me he was willing to accept the consequences for his actions, that said the world about the kind of man he would become. He didn't make excuses, he didn't try to justify his actions. He apologized for skipping my class. He accepted the consequences.

don't know whatever became of him...whether he went to school, joined the military, or what. I hope what happened was good since this was a young man who didn't start at

the same point with the same advantages as other children, but from where he did start and with what he did have, he was such a pleasure to have known and to have had in class and what a wonderful student and individual he was.

May he and other students like him always have doors open to them and a lifetime of happiness and success awaiting....



Maintenance Committee Report September 15, 2025

At our meeting the following amenities were discussed. The **Facilities Management Plan (FMP)** format is used: The **FMP** continues to be updated.

Landscape Management:

- 1. Truscapes is performing the weekly turf mowing and triming.
- Truscapes applied weed killer, turf and ornamental fertilization and weeded.
- The MC cleaned up debris and trimmed along the fence on Old Venice Road.
- 4 The MC continues to rake up and collect for disposal fallen limbs and palm fronds throughout the community.
- 5. Rogelio Landscaping performing monthly maintenance at the entrances and islands throughout the community.
- 6. The MC trimmed bushes and cleaned up debris on the north side of Rivendell Blvd and Old Venice Road.
- 7. Dead Xoria were replaced on Rainbow Point Way islands.
- Received a bid from ASAP Fence and Gates to remove 2 sections of fence and install equipment access gate on Rivendell Blvd to access the Common Area along the Cottages ROW. \$ 1,250. Completed
- 9. The MC repaired curb and added topsoil backup on corner of Oak Preserve.
- 10. Truscapes performed insect, fungus and turf weed inspection and treated where applicable.

Tree Trimming:

 Green Topps trimmed 1 large Pine and removed 2 dead Pines on Mallard Marsh ad trimmed 1 oak on Golden Pond.

Irrigation System:

- 1. TruScapes conducted the August inspection and replaced faulty irrigation heads throughout the community.
- 2. The MC repaired controller 10

Community Pool and Clock Tower:

Community Pool Pump Room:

1. Southwest Pools performed the weekly pool servicing and troubleshooting low flow issues.

Roadways:

 The balance of the roadways throughout are not scheduled to be resurfaced this summer, but in 2026 by the county. They will use Reclamite, instead of conventional asphalt.

Sidewalks:

- The annual list of sidewalk slabs that need replacing by the county for 2025 was developed and submitted to the county for repair and they started repairs.
- 2. Cleaning of Common Area sidewalks is being evaluated. Seeking bids, Fall project.
- 3. A new concrete sidewalk and possible relocation is needed from Rivendell Blvd to the Banyan Tree. Project on hold for further discussion.

Street Light Poles:

- 1. Nostalgic Lamppost's conducted by monthly service and inspection.
- 2. The MC replaced bulbs at Crescent Park

Holiday Lighting:

Playground, Gazebo and Benches:

1. Board approved 4 new benches to replace rusting metal benches; and in Rainbow Point Park to replace faulty concrete benches. Completed by MC.

Pine View Path

- 1. MC will be receiving estimates on repairs and eventual resurfacing of the path.
- 2. Green Topps bid \$11,000 to clean up and trim trees along both sides of the path. Completed

Drainage System:

1. The need to replace flowthrough drainage frame and grate at Golden Pond is on Rivendell. The MC receiving a bid from Rick Richards.
